# Covid and our return Suggested Lodge and Chapter Checklist/To Do list

Task	Done
<ul> <li>1. Contact the Lodge/Chapter Venue to ensure Covid Secure compliance</li> <li>All venues should be Covid compliant and self certified</li> <li>Province or District should be made aware of any issues as soon as they arise</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>2. Ask for a copy of Covid Secure compliance/risk assessment</li> <li>A Covid risk assessment should be in place or in progress. You may get asked for this by your own Members. Please be patient with Hall Teams, this guidance is subject to sudden change.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Attendance procedures in place, including details of maximum attendance figures</li> <li>If your Lodge/Chapter room has a maximum attendance, you should be aware of this in advance to manage meeting numbers.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>4. Appointed persons identified to welcome guest in lieu of a Tylers/Janitors book</li> <li>This avoids congregation points on landings and in ante rooms.</li> <li>Tylers/Janitors books can be filled in by one person</li> <li>For track and trace (if applicable) this produces a register of guests for the Hall/venue to keep for the required times as per the legislation of the day.</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>5. Payments by electronic and non contact means - reducing cash handling</li> <li>Purchase a handheld card reader i.e. SumUp/Zettle etc to receive electronic payments for meals, significantly reducing contact for payments - Visa/Mastercard/Apple Pay/GPay</li> <li>Pre Pay arrangements for members and Guests meals</li> <li>Alms etc by bank transfer or annual contribution</li> <li>Cheque payments for those who prefer not to pay by any of the above</li> <li>Alms collections to be left in the collection box/bag for 72 hours before handling</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>6. Preparing for Ceremonies</li> <li>Lateral flow testing packs in place for ceremony participants preferably at home before leaving but availability at the Masonic Hall/Venue - Free tests are available for all at: <a href="https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests">https://www.gov.uk/order-coronavirus-rapid-lateral-flow-tests</a></li> <li>Back up Officers considered for Ceremonies in case of Positive tests</li> </ul>
