There will be many messages, but what sits solidly in my mind, is that during the 2019/20 financial year, the Masonic Charitable Foundation (MCF, the Freemasons' charity) spent almost £650,000 supporting East Lancashire Freemasons and their dependents who were in need. This also included providing support to local charities in East Lancashire, and COVID-19-related work within the Province, such as looking after young carers, the homeless, victims of domestic abuse, those suffering with poor mental health and providing food and PPE where it was needed. Brethren and companions – it is now our opportunity to give something back!

My sincere wish is that each of us, in our own way, will offer our full support to the Festival and continue to demonstrate that great virtue which is the distinguishing characteristic of a Freemason's heart.

When Mark's wife, Jacqui, was involved in a car accident which left her with serious brain injuries, their lives and the lives of their two daughters, Ella and Grace were changed forever.

I'm not someone who would usually ask for help, but when I finally contacted my lodge Almoner, he was already waiting for me.

I told him what had happened, and that my family were now facing severe financial difficulties as a result. We put together an application, and the MCF soon came back with a grant to help me cover the cost of our bills.

"Now, we receive costs towards our travel so that we are able to visit Jacqui regularly. We go every week, and it's particularly important for the girls. Visiting will always be an emotional struggle, but I have got good friends to support me and my family.

"The support from the MCF has been ten out of ten, there is no shadow of a doubt. I feel like they've got my back and my daughters' backs. It's not just the money, it's the sense of family."

After a premature birth, Ted developed cerebral palsy and his mobility is severely affected. His mother, Sally, turned to the MCF for help with Ted's walking.

I got in touch with the MCF, and they helped us fund an Upsee mobility harness, which allows for assisted walking. This means Ted is able to enjoy the great outdoors!

"Now, Ted is able to do so much more than he could before. He can join in with his brother when they run around the garden, and loves chasing Alex around their grandparents' house!

"The boys love holding hands with each other and cuddling – it's moments like these that make having twins really special. The MCF's support has really given Ted a sense of independence, which is really important for a growing child. We are all so thankful."



MCF support in East Lancashire

Mary's son, Henry, started ballroom and Latin dancing classes when he was eight, but soon had to seek support from the MCF in order for him to continue his passion.

Henry's parents were paying £200 on lessons each week, £250 for a shirt, and £2,000 for a tail suit – of which he has needed five in the past four years.

"We struggled on with visa bills, working overtime, and petrol costs for travel to Henry's classes and competitions. I looked at our family finances and worried that we might not financially manage to keep this up until he's 16," says Mary.

"I heard about the MCF's support through the grandparent of another child that dances on the same circuit as Henry; he posted on social media about how his granddaughters wouldn't be able to do what they do without the support of the MCF. So I consulted my dad, an East Lancashire Freemason, and said, "let's look into this for Henry". I completed the application form and received the grant, and the support has been life changing."


